- Radon is an invisible, odorless radioactive gas that can build up to dangerous levels indoors.
- Radon is the leading cause of lung-cancer in nonsmokers, and the second leading cause after direct smoking.
- EPA estimates that 1 out of 15 homes have high radon; levels can vary greatly from home to home.
- The only way to know if you have a radon problem in a home or other building is to test.
- You can test your home for radon with an easy, inexpensive, do-it-yourself kit from a home improvement or hardware store or on-line.
- High radon homes can be fixed, and new homes can be built radon-resistant, with proven, cost-effective techniques.
